2019 CCS Credit Project Solicitation Webinar

Purpose:

 To fund projects that will enhance or restore and protect high quality greater sagegrouse habitat in Nevada that will also create a supply of compensatory credits to be used in the Nevada Conservation Credit System.

• The funds available can be used for:

- Habitat enhancement or restoration
- Running the Habitat Quantification Tool to develop sellable credits
- Developing a long-term management plan to maintain the habitat

Nevada Conservation Credit System

- Innovative, science-based mitigation program created by Nevada, for Nevada, to provide incentives for landowners and managers to enhance and protect greater sage-grouse habitat.

Eligibility Criteria

- Location within mapped habitat management categories.
- Timeline funded actions to be implemented over next 24 months
- CCS Participation must be willing to sell credits developed and commit to long-term project maintenance, as defined in the CCS
- Willingness to provide site information and access
- Habitat Quality and Quantity
- Enhancement or restoration actions to be implemented

Figure 1. The map shows the greater sage-grouse habitat management category areas. Projects must be located in these locations to be eligible.

- Project Area Habitat Quality
- Surrounding Habitat Suitability
- Risk Assessment Invasive Annuals
- Risk Assessment Wildfire
- Project Size
- Surrounding Land Ownership
- Active Sage-Grouse Leks
- Anthropogenic Disturbance
- Habitat Improvement and Risk Reduction
- Cost Effectiveness
- Relevance to Areas of Elevated Priority for Mitigation
- Other

Figure 2. The map shows the Biologically Significant Areas (BSUs) most in need of credits to offset disturbances locally. Projects in these locations will receive a bonus in the ranking process.

Timeline

- Friday, October 18th, 2019 at 10:00 am PST: Question and Answer conference call and webinar will be held. See how to register below.
- Friday, November 1st, 2019 at 5:00 pm PST: Letters of Interest due.
- Friday, November 8th, 2019 at 5:00 pm PST: Projects selected to move forward in the process.
- Monday, December 2nd, 2019 at 5:00 pm PST: Final Proposals due.
- Late December of 2019 or Early January of 2020: Seed grant awardees announced with agreements expected to be finalized shortly thereafter.
- April 15th to June 30th of 2020 Habitat Quantification Tool (HQT) implementation period to determine credits available.
- July of 2020 to spring of 2022 Develop and finalize Management Plan development and implement habitat improvement actions.
- Until 2030 Implement management plan, submit annual management and monitoring reports, and if credits are not sold at an earlier date, maintain credits available for sale at a price suitable to you.

Re-Payment to the State

• The State will recapture awarded funds as credits are sold on a per credit basis.
