INITIAL STATE COORDINATION

- SETT & NDOW staff meet September 14-15
- Discussed Strategic Action Plan (SAP) and Sagebrush Habitat Plan (SHP) (EO 2021-18) being complementary
- Timelines SAP mid 2022; SHP December 31, 2023
- Threats Existing or Potential Tools/Guidance
 - Fire/Invasive Annual Grasses Tool
 - Ecological Integrity/R&R/Invasives Tool
 - Ravens Tool
 - PJ Expansion Tool
 - Anthropogenic Disturbances/Fragmentation CCS
 - Wild Horse Exceedance of AML Guidance
 - Improper Livestock Grazing Guidance

COARSE OVERVIEW

- Strategic Action Plan / Sagebrush Habitat Plan to focus on multiple species (sagebrush focused)
 - Intact core habitats
 - Many tools and guidance sage-grouse oriented
- NDOW sagebrush steppe habitat maps (multi-species)
 - Overlay or in tandem with existing mapping layers
- Use/Develop tools and guidance
 - Ecological Integrity (Invasives and Fire)
 - Migration and Connectivity
- Determine key threats in core areas
- Develop cost analysis for treatment types

CORE AREAS

- Statewide Sagebrush Core Habitats
- SAP Cores within 6 regional areas
 - Based on threats, identify areas of potential treatment/need
 - Update maps and provide guidance on threats using existing tools
- Benefits/opportunities of establishing core areas
 - May provide enhanced funding opportunities
 - Align and maximize efforts/resources
 - Provide greater guidance for conservation strategies
 - Possible incorporation into Land Use Plans
 - Assist with CCS mitigation on public lands
 - Incorporation of Adaptive Management Framework

NEXT STEPS

- Review new tools and science
 - Explore need/opportunity for NV specific use
- USGS Conservation Planning Tools
 - Timelines for availability/use
 - Constraints?
- Collaborative meeting with state and federal agencies
 - Discuss current priorities, directives, planning efforts, funding
 - Conservation tools being used/considered
 - NEPA Project ready, non-funded, minimal planning, locations

NEXT STEPS & CONSIDERATIONS

- Collaborative meetings with stakeholders
 - Federal, State, Counties, Tribal Nations
 - Local conservation groups
 - NGOs
 - Others
- SAP Update
 - Shorter timeline
 - Use of existing or soon to be ready tools
 - More frequent updating (progress, new disturbance (man-made & acts of nature), adaptive management incorporation, increased assistance to local conservation groups)
 - Promote statewide reporting to a database
 - SETT staffing limitations
