1. Conflict of Interest Definition

When a Verifier’s commitments and obligations to the CCS program have the potential to be compromised by the Verifier’s other material interests or relationships (especially economic), a potential or actual conflict of interest exists. This is particularly the case if those interests or commitments are not disclosed.

The Lead Verifier should indicate below whether they or anyone else working on the aforementioned project have an economic interest in the results of their verification effort, or relationships with individuals and/or an outside entity that stand(s) to benefit economically from the project. The Lead Verifier should also disclose any personal, business, or other affiliations that may give rise to a real or apparent conflict of interest. Potential conflicts of interest will be evaluated. Where potential conflicts are significant Verifiers may be asked to refrain from verification efforts for a specific project.

3. Integrity

5. Standards

Verifiers complete and submit all aspects of the project in a timely manner, keeping to a high standard, and as complete as possible to keep turn-around time to a minimum.

The Sagebrush Ecosystem Program expects Verifiers to comply with this Code of Conduct. Failure to comply with this Code of Conduct may result in the termination of a Verifier’s certification with the Sagebrush Ecosystem Program.
